DECISION NEARING ON NEW COUNCIL DISTRICTS

The public has until March 15 to comment on new City Council election districts. The California Voters Rights Act mandates districts be updated every 10 years with new Census data. With the results of the 2020 Census now available, the redistricting process began in Lake Forest in September.

The City last drew Council districts in 2017 under the threat of a California Voting Rights Act lawsuit. Three Council members were elected by district in 2018; the transition was completed in 2020 when the two remaining Lake Forest seats moved to districts.

By law, the new districts must be in place by April 17, 2022. Before then, the City will hold public hearings and allow the public to submit their own proposals for district maps through an online mapping tool. Bear Demographics, LLC of Toluca Lake is guiding the Lake Forest redistricting process.

Lake Forest gained more than 8,000 residents since 2010, according to the latest Census figures. The City's population now stands at 85,858.

Aside from the COVID pandemic, wildfires have emerged as a key concern in our State. All but two of the 20 largest wildfires in California history have occurred since 2000, with nine of them coming in 2020 and 2021. Although not in the list of the largest fires, the Bond and Silverado fires forced evacuations in Lake Forest in 2020.

That's why we all must do as much as we can to be ready. Homeowners know to keep a defensible space of 100 feet or so between buildings and dense vegetation. Our homeowners' associations do a good job of clearing that dry vegetation, too. But there's more we can do to harden our homes. Our partners at the Orange County Fire Authority have provided tips you can find on pages 6 and 7 of this issue. While defensible space can slow the spread of flames, home hardening – enclosing eaves, installing double-paned windows, and caring for patio covers and balconies – can keep flying embers from erupting into a structure fire.

You'll also find in this issue, and at www.lakeforestca.gov/ wildfires, our City's evacuation zones. Knowing your zone is crucial if the Fire Authority and OC Sheriff's Department need to clear neighborhoods ahead of danger. You'll get information of a potential evacuation by signing up at www.alertoc.org and www.nixle.com.

We're doing our part to be ready at City Hall, too. We've enlisted a specialist to bolster our comprehensive Emergency Management Plan as well as provide advanced Emergency Operations Center training to staff.

If nothing else, the past two years have shown us we need to be prepared for anything. Let's all do our part to be ready, and may 2022 be a better year for us all.

COUNCIL APPROVES FIRST STEPS FOR TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS

The City Council in December approved contracts with a team of consultants to design 12 traffic-improvement projects throughout the City.

The 12 projects are:

- Second left-turn lanes in all directions at Los Alisos and Muirlands
- Widening southbound Rancho Parkway at Lake Forest
- Raised medians on El Toro between Jeronimo and Trabuco
- Improvements to the medians on arterials throughout the City
- Widening westbound Los Alisos to add a dedicated right-turn lane at Rockfield
- Traffic improvements at Bake and Baffin Bay
- Resurfacing Lake Forest Drive
- Resurfacing El Toro Road
- Resurfacing Trabuco Road
- Resurfacing Bake from Rancho Parkway South to South Pointe Drive

As a contract city, Lake Forest uses consultants to provide street and traffic design services. Four consultant firms were brought on board for the 12 projects. The consultants develop, analyze, and provide recommendations for the project before ultimately developing the concepts into complete specifications and buildable improvement plans. The use of consultants allows the City to keep employee costs at a minimum.

The design work is expected to take up to two years. The agreements are in place until 2024.



TWO WAYS TO GET HELP

The City is partnering with the Orange County Fire Authority and Orange County Sheriff's Department for a "Stay Safe Lake Forest" Town Hall on fire safety at 6:30 p.m. on February 24 at the Civic Center.

The Fire Authority will provide more information about home hardening, while the Sheriff's Department will discuss evacuation procedures and when an evacuated area is reopened.

The Town Hall will also be streamed on the Lake Forest Channel on Cox Cable, channel 851.

Additionally, the Fire Authority offers free wildfire home assessments. Call (714) 573-6774 to schedule an assessment at your home.

BE EMBER AWARE

Most homeowners, especially those who live near natural open space or other fire-prone areas, have heard about the need for "defensible space" - creating a buffer between a home and vegetation that could fuel flames. Good vegetation management is the responsibility of every member of the community and has been very effective in helping protect homes in Lake Forest during wildland fire events more than once.

But did you know that embers picked up by winds can travel as much as five miles and ignite a home fire far ahead of flames? Most homes are damaged or lost in a wildfire because of contact with embers, not flames. That's where home hardening comes in - taking steps that will close off your home to the heat and embers of an approaching wildfire.

When a single home catches fire due to ember intrusion, the radiant heat from can cause nearby homes to burn more readily, home hardening needs to be a community effort to provide the most effective way to prevent loss during a wildfire event.

IMMEDIATE ZONE 0-5 FT

The main objective of the Immediate Zone or 0-to-5-foot zone is to reduce the potential that embers landing near a building will ignite fuels (vegetation and other combustible material) and expose the area around a home to direct flame.

Install hard surfaces, such as a concrete walkway, or use noncombustible mulch products, such as rock. Keep the lawn well irrigated and use low-growing herbaceous (nonwoody) plants. Shrubs and trees are not recommended in the 5-foot zone.

WINDOWS

Extreme heat during a wildfire can cause window glass to crack and fail, giving embers an easy entry into a home. Replacing a home's single-pane windows with dual-pane glass will help guard against fires. The outer pane can act as a thermal shield for the second pane, and using tempered glass adds even more protection. If it isn't possible to replace existing single pane windows, another cost effective fix is to reduce the amount of vegetation and other combustible materials outside of the windows.

WALLS AND SIDING

Combustible siding, such as wood or vinyl, will catch fire but ensure they're covered with 1/8 inch metal mesh or or melt and threaten the interior of a home. Burning consider replacing with ember resistant baffled vents. This siding can also spread to the roof, rain gutters, eaves, vents, decks, and patio covers, creating even more danger. - Source: Orange County Fire Authority. EAVES

Eaves play an important role in protecting a home from damaging water flowing off the roof, but open eaves can trap embers that will ignite a structure. If you can see the rafter tails of 2x4 or 2x6 lumber, you have open eaves. Closing off - or "boxing" - those eaves can keep embers out. If that's not possible, sealing gaps, cracks and crevices with caulk will provide some protection, as will ensuring your paint is in good condition. Replace with sealing the gaps with caulk and a good coat of paint will reduce embers from lodging in the eaves.

FENCES

Fences make good neighbors. Wooden fences can also make good fire-starters. Use a fire-resistant material wherever possible, and be sure to keep the fence clear of dead vegetation and other plant debris. If you can't afford to replace entire fence think about replacing at least the first 5 feet from the house.

CHIMNEYS

An exposed chimney opening puts your home – and community - at risk. A spark arrester with openings no larger than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch and no smaller than 3/8 inch will keep embers from your fireplace out of the community and embers from an approaching wildfire out of your home.

BALCONIES AND DECKS

If you're adding a deck, use metal, masonry or lightweight concrete if possible. With an existing deck made or wood or other flammable material, keep the surface clear of plant debris, do not store combustible materials - including firewood – beneath the deck and caulk any gaps between the deck and the exterior wall of your home.

PATIO COVERS

Ensure your patio cover is made of a non-combustible material. If an ember falls on a wooden or cloth patio cover, your home's roof, eaves, and siding will be exposed to radiant heat and open flames. Just like with balconies, install metal flashing between a wood patio cover and the exterior wall of your home. If it isn't cost effective to replace your patio cover, keep the wood in good repair free of rot and similar to eaves, seal gaps and cracks with caulk and a good coat of paint to provide some protection from embers

VENTS

Vents are important to allow moisture to escape your attic, will allow the air to flow but keep embers (and rodents) out.

IN AN EMERGENCY

During a wildfire or other emergency, authorities and the City of Lake Forest will share critical information with residents several ways:

ALERT OC: Ensure you and your family are signed up for Alert OC, which County and City officials use for emergency notifications. www.alertoc.org

NIXLE: The City will share important information via Nixle, which will contact residents via text, email, or voice call. You can register by texting LakeForest to 888777 but going to www.nixle.com allows you to enter your address so the City can send geographically specific messages if necessary.

WEBSITE: Critical news is posted on the City's website, www.lakeforestca. gov. Evacuation information is at www. lakeforestca.gov/wildfires.


COX 851: Lake Forest broadcasts City and emergency information on Cox Channel 851 within the City of Lake Forest. City Council and Commission meetings are also broadcast.

<u>AM 1690:</u> The City operates AM 1690, a low-power radio station that broadcasts City news and emergency information. In an emergency, tune into AM 1690 for important updates. You can also tune in over the internet at https://bit.ly/lakeforestAM1690

SOCIAL MEDIA: The City uses Nextdoor, Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. Follow Lake Forest, CA for City news and emergency updates.

<u>CITY HOTLINE</u>: During an emergency, the City updates its hotline with information about evacuations or other important news. The recorded hotline is at (949) 461-3536.

OWN YOUR ZONE



Did you know Lake Forest is divided into 30 evacuation zones? Even more importantly, do you know what zone your home or business is in? In a wildfire or other emergency, the Orange County Sheriff's Department and City will notify those in Lake Forest of potential evacuations by zone.

Learn your zone by entering your address in the interactive map at www. lakeforestca.gov/wildfires.

The map will also be updated during an emergency to show which zones are under evacuation warnings, or full evacuations. And while the information is on the City's wildfire page, remember other emergencies, such as explosions or gas leaks, could lead to evacuations, as well.

LAKE FOREST DEPUTIES GET BODY-WORN CAMERAS

Orange County Sheriff's Deputies patrolling Lake Forest have added another piece of equipment to their uniforms: body-worn cameras that record their interactions with the public.

The Sheriff's Department continues to roll out its phased approach to equipping patrol personnel with body-worn cameras to increase transparency and accountability.

The program was launched in October and in November personnel in the department's southeast patrol areas – Lake Forest, Mission Viejo, Rancho Santa Margarita and south unincorporated areas – were outfitted with cameras. All OC Sheriff patrol personnel are expected to have cameras by the end of 2022.

The Department also is upgrading its in-car camera systems, which have been in place for more than three decades.



LAKE FOREST NEEDS STARS!

Are you ready to be a STARS volunteer in your community?

The Sheriff's Team of Active Retired Seniors (STARS) is a senior citizen volunteer program through the City of Lake Forest. It was founded in 1997 to assist the City and Lake Forest Police Services.

STARS assist the City and Sheriff's Department by helping with Neighborhood Watch programs, business checks, home vacation checks, and by providing clerical support in the Lake Forest City substation, and more.

To qualify, you must be a Lake Forest resident willing to donate four to six hours weekly and possess a California driver's license. Volunteers must also have a clean background, pass an initial physical exam and provide a letter from their physician stating that the volunteer is currently in satisfactory health and can perform the duties required in the STARS program.

BUSINESS, SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT TEAM UP IN BUSINESS WATCH

Business Watch is a free crime-prevention program designed for businesses in the City of Lake Forest. The goal of the program is to bring businesses together with law enforcement to prevent and reduce crime in the community.

Why Business Watch? Citizen involvement is essential to prevent crime. Business owners and employees are the ones who really know what is going on in your community. By cooperating with each other and Lake Forest Police Services, people can help fight crime in their community in the most effective way - before it begins!

After registering your business, a representative from the Orange County Sheriff's Department will attach a Business Watch sticker to the storefront window. In the event a crime occurs at that business, deputies will be able to retrieve your emergency contact information and contact the owner immediately. Getting everyone involved, employees as well as employers, will develop a comprehensive approach to safety for each individual business as well as the entire business community. The Sheriff's Department Crime Prevention Unit will also provide business owners with periodical emails regarding recent crime trends, as well as crime-prevention tips.

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POWER SHUTOFFS AND IRRIGATION POLLUTION



LAKE FOREST

Southern California Edison shuts down power to select circuits during high winds to reduce the chances of wildfire. The shutdowns, also known as Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS) can have an unfortunate by-product... resetting your

irrigation controller and causing irrigation pollution!

Irrigation controllers depend on a constant supply of power to maintain their programming, and most have a backup battery in the case of a power outage - that is, if the battery is still holding a charge. If it isn't, your controller could be reset to its factory settings, which can result in excessive irrigation. Irrigation discharges are a prohibited discharge because they can mobilize pollutants. Pollutants such as sediment, bacteria, and nutrients can be transported by excessive irrigation to our local creeks, lakes, and the ocean. How can you prevent this type of water waste and pollution? Routinely replace back-up batteries to ensure they are holding a charge. After a PSPS, look at your irrigation controller and confirm that your scheduling has weathered the shutoff.

Becoming more familiar with your irrigation controller and ensuring the backup battery is fresh can lead to a more efficient irrigation system, protect the environment, and save you money!

WHAT IS A PUBLIC SAFETY **POWER SHUTOFF?**

When weather conditions create a high risk for a wildfire, Southern California Edison (SCE) may temporarily shut off power to your neighborhood to prevent our electric system from becoming the source of ignition. These outages are called Public Safety Power Shutoffs.

SCE monitors weather forecasts and will begin preparing for a PSPS a week ahead of anticipated winds. Residents are sent initial notices of potential shutdowns three days ahead of the anticipated winds, with updates daily after that.

Residents can sign up for email, text, or voice notifications. Residents who are a SCE Medical Baseline customers and depend on powered medical equipment should plan to have a backup power source, such as an uninterruptible power supply, or a backup location in case of a power outage.

BE PREPARED FOR AN EMERGENCY: JOIN CERT

Want to be able to help your family, neighbors, and community after a large-scale disaster? Experts say it may take up to three days for first responders to reach you after a large earthquake or other catastrophic event. That's where the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) comes in. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) program trains residents emergency first aid, basic search and rescue, and more over eight weekly sessions taught in Lake Forest.

He will be happy to sit on the sofa next to his owners. Outside of wanting to protect his family from unknown people, Kooper is the perfect gentleman. He'll sit for treats, does well on walks, and calmly greets other small dogs.

Although Kooper ended up at the shelter briefly, the PAC-OC tries to help Lake Forest owners with their pets prior to taking them to the shelter. If the organization is unable to assist, it can provide referrals to other resources. PAC-OC also offers counseling to those who would like to keep their pets but are having difficulties. The PAC-OC continues to offer volunteer opportunities for adults, as well as for students 16-17 years old—with an adult volunteering with them.

HOMETOWN HERO BANNERS AVAILABLE

The Hometown Hero Banner Program is for residents wishing to honor their own Hometown Hero, currently serving, retired or deceased from all branches of the armed forces with a connection to the City of Lake Forest. The banners will be flown on Civic Center Drive leading up to the Civic Center campus. Twenty banners will be available to purchase for the 2022 Hometown Heroes Banner Program. Banners will be displayed for a one-year period from May 2022 through May 2023.

The program includes:

- The purchase of a banner (\$300) including the honoree's name, a formal military photo and their armed forces branch.
- The banner will be displayed on a street pole on Civic Center Drive for a period of one year.
- To extend the banner display period beyond the one year time frame, and have the honoree's banner hung for the following year, applicants must reapply and pay a \$100 renewal fee during the Spring 2023 application period.

To qualify, a honoree must be able to verify duty status and be able to verify a connection to the City of Lake Forest (i.e. current City of Lake Forest resident and immediate family member of a current resident, such as wife/husband, son/daughter, grandson/ grandaughter, son-in-law/daughter-in-law).





- \$3.00 One-Way (\$6.00 Round Trip) Within Lake Forest city limits to non-emergency medical appointments, socializing, movies, etc.
- \$7.00 One-Way (\$14.00 Round Trip)

To and from non-emergency medical appointments to Saddleback Memorial Hospital, Mission Hospital, South County Orthopedic Specialist, Kaiser Hospital (Irvine), and Hoag Hospital (Irvine).

• **\$10.00 Lost Card Fee** - A \$10 fee will be charged to any taxi participant who has lost their card and requires a replacement card.

For new program users to take advantage of the Senior Taxi Cab program:

- You must have a current DMV Identification Card verifying that you're a Lake Forest resident to take part in this program.
- Call 461-3408 to make an appointment to register and take your photo ID for the City of Lake Forest Taxi Program.

Note: All Taxi passengers must be 60 years of age or better. It may take up to two weeks from the time you register for the program, and take your picture for your ID card, for the card to be valid for you to make a taxi reservation. 
