A Message From City Manager
DEBRA ROSE

July was officially "Parks Make Life Better Month," but in Lake Forest we know that our 32 parks are important to residents year-round. That's why we were pleased to see a report by the Trust for Public Land (TPL) that found that Lake Forest is well above the national median when it comes not only to amount of land dedicated to parks, but how close our parks are to where residents live.

The Trust for Public Land is a national non-profit organization founded in 1972 on the belief that access to nature and the outdoors is important. The group measures cities across the country to determine how much land in any given community is set aside for parks, and how many residents live within a 10-minute walk of a park.

The TPL found 76 percent of our City's residents live within a 10-minute walk of a park, well above the national median of 55 percent. TPL, which included Whiting Regional Park, also determined 20 percent of Lake Forest's land is used for parks and recreation, again above the national median of 15 percent.

We use our biennial survey to get feedback from residents on how well we're providing essential services. In 2014, residents indicated they wanted to see us improve the condition of our parks. In 2018, the City Council approved renovations to 10 neighborhood parks after a series of public meetings to find out what residents wanted in the parks – such as a second universally accessible park, at Cherry Park. We're about half-way through the \$7 million program, with work now underway at Vintage and Sundowner parks.

I'm proud to say that our latest survey, in 2021, found 91 percent of residents were "very" or "somewhat" satisfied with the job the City does maintaining our parks. Parks Make Life Better, and Lake Forest is committed to making our parks better.

LAKE FOREST CONNECTS RESIDENTS TO THE OUTDOORS

More than three quarters of Lake Forest residents live within a 10-minute walk of a park, according to the Trust for Public Land's ParkServe database.

The "10-Minute Walk" campaign looks at the park access for residents in 14,000 cities across the nation. Lake Forest is more than 20 percent higher than the national median of 55 percent when it comes to close-to-home parks.

About 20 percent of land in the City is used for parks and recreation, compared to the national median of 15 percent, the Trust for Public Land says. Each of the 32 parks in Lake Forest offers a variety of recreational amenities for residents to enjoy year-round.

The Trust for Public Land is a nonprofit organization founded in 1972. The organization and its Parks for People Program work with communities to protect and create close-to-home parks in and near cities where 80 percent of Americans live.

Lake Forest isn't just sitting on its laurels. The City continues to improve its parks.

City Council approved renovations to 10 neighborhood parks in 2018. Improvements range from re-placements of trash cans, benches, tables, and other park amenities to full redesigns of playgrounds. Darrin, Montbury, Pebble Creek, Peachwood, and Cherry parks are finished. Vintage and Sundowner are under construction. Work is expected to begin this year on Borrego Overlook, Regency, and Rancho Serrano parks to finish the \$7 million project.


FLAG WAVING ABOVE VETERANS PARK

Residents, city staff, the Orange County Sheriff's Department Color Guard, and Boy Scout Troops 628 and 604 were on hand on June 14 to hoist the American flag above Veterans Park for the first time.

Veterans Park was rebuilt and dedicated in 2019, featuring a monument dedicated to each branch of the armed services. Mosaic tile flags sit folded atop each of the monuments. The park, which also features a large pond, meandering trails, and a bird/butterfly garden, won awards but didn't win over all of the public – some thought it needed a traditional flagpole, as well.

The City Council earlier this year agreed, and directed the installation of a flag pole.





LEADING FINANCE **ASSOCIATION HONORS** LAKE FOREST

The nation's leading government finance association honored Lake Forest with awards for the City's budget presentation and annual financial report.

The Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA), founded in 1906, represents public finance officials throughout the United States and Canada. The association has more than 20,000 federal, state, and local members deeply involved in planning, financing, and implementing thousands of governmental operations in their jurisdictions. GFOA's mission is to advance excellence in public finance.

The Lake Forest Finance Department received two honors:

Distinguished Budget Presentation Award

GFOA established the Distinguished Budget Presentation



Awards Program to recognize state and local governments that prepare budget documents of the very highest quality that reflect both the guidelines established by the

National Advisory Council on State and Local Budgeting and the GFOA's best practices. To earn recognition, budget documents must meet program criteria and excel as a policy document, financial plan, operations guide, and communication tool.

Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting

The City was also recognized for its 2020 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report for the 27th consecutive year. The award honors state and local governments that go beyond the minimum requirements of generally accepted accounting principles to prepare annual comprehensive financial reports that evidence the spirit of transparency and full disclosure, and then to recognize individual governments that succeed in achieving that goal.



RESIDENT FEEDBACK **LEADS TO NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENTS**

New red curbs are in place and additional lighting is planned for a Southwest Lake Forest neighborhood, after a months-long outreach effort with residents.

City staff and contractors went door-to-door to survey residents in the neighborhood off Raymond Way near the Post Office to ask what they thought could improve their quality of life in the City. Although 90 percent of those surveyed in the Lake Forest 2021 Resident and Business Satisfaction Survey shared favorable opinions about their quality of life, City leaders recognized room for improvement in Southwest Lake Forest.

Southwest Lake Forest is generally bounded by the freeway, Ridge Route Drive, Trabuco Road and Los Alisos Boulevard.

The door-to-door survey, followed by a pop-up event at the end of Packer Place, found that residents had concerns about parking, lighting, illegal dumping, and code enforcement. In response to those concerns, the City held a bulky item collection event in January, added red curbs to the neighborhood, and asked code enforcement and the Orange County Sheriff's Department to increase their activities in the area.

New lighting is also planned for the park-like area between Packer Place and Cavanaugh Road.

The outreach project was honored by the Orange County chapter of the American Planning Association.

Additional work will continue in that neighborhood, as City officials prepare to launch a similar effort elsewhere in the southwest portion of the City.

LAKE FOREST BUDGET REMAINS HEALTHY

Property taxes are anticipated to be the largest contributor to the City's Fiscal Year 2022-23 budget, followed by sales taxes. In a budget approved in June by the City Council, property taxes are anticipated to generate \$23.5 million, with sales taxes raising \$18.7 million in revenue. Other revenues will raise the City's total anticipated General Fund revenues for FY 22-23 to \$57.3 million.

The City's spending plan for the General Fund – which covers the City's day-to-day operations – is \$52.6 million. The largest single expenditures go to public safety, at \$21.1 million. With anticipated revenues outpacing budgeted expenditures by \$4,7 million, the City's reserves are fully funded at \$52.3 million. The Capital Improvement Plan budget is separate from the General Fund and includes the continuing Neighborhood Improvement Plan, which includes renovations to Borrego Overlook Park, Rancho Serrano Park, Regency Park, Sundowner Park, and Vintage Park.

The Capital Improvement Plan also includes 14 street and intersection improvement projects, including:

- Median Improvements at Bake Parkway and Baffin Bay
- Dual turn lanes at El Toro Road and Portola Parkway
- Slurry seal work at Jeronimo Road and Muirlands Boulevard (with a \$248,199 federal grant)

WORK CONTINUES ON MOUNTAIN VIEW AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECT



A 71-unit affordable housing project is taking shape on El Toro Road, near the Post Office. The Mountain View apartment community will bring much-needed housing to individuals and families with household incomes below 60 percent of the area's median.

National Community Renaissance (National CORE), based in Southern California, is developing the project, which includes one-, two-, and three-bedroom apartments. National CORE manages nearly 9,000 affordable, senior, and marketrate units in California, Texas, and Florida. The City loaned National CORE \$3.7 million in housing funds collected from other developers who did not include affordable units in their projects.

Construction is also underway on the Portola Senior Apartments, the City's first mixed-use project and part of the City's Portola Center Area Plan. That project, being developed by Community HousingWorks, includes 58 affordable apartments for seniors earning 50 percent of the Area Median Income. It will serve senior households 62+ years as couples, or individuals, in one-bedroom apartments with features to aid in aging-in-place.

The Meadows community, under construction on Bake Parkway, will include 126 affordable apartments for seniors. Building permits are expected to be pulled for that project by the end of the year.

LOW-COST HOME IMPROVEMENT LOANS AVAILABLE

Does your home need new stucco, windows, roofs or other improvements? You might qualify for a zero-percent, deferred-interest home-improvement loan or a 3 percent interest loan through the City's Housing Rehabilitation Program.

The City Council funds the program with federal Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) funds to ensure residents can live in safe, efficient homes. Most home improvement items are eligible for assistance, such as plumbing, electrical, energy and weatherization items, garage doors, fumigation, flooring and other items necessary for the health and safety of occupants.

Mobile home owners can receive up to \$15,000 and single-family homeowners can receive up to \$30,000. The zero-percent interest deferred loan has no monthly payments. Total payment is due if the resident is no longer residing in the home, at the time of sale, refinance, or transfer of title. The 3 percent interest loan requires monthly payments and is fully amortized over 15 years.

In addition to income requirements in the chart below, applicants must also:

- Live on the property
- May not have received previous assistance
- Meet the asset limitation
- Have sufficient equity in the home

OC READY TO BATTLE FIRES FROM AIR



The Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) and Southern California Edison partnered to create an airborne Quick Reaction Force to battle wildfires in Lake Forest and throughout the county. The task force consists of two Boeing CH-47 Chinook helitankers that can each carry up to 3,000 gallons of water or fire retardant, a Sikorski S-61 helitanker with a 1,000 gallon capacity and a S-76 intelligence and reconnaissance helicopter.

The CH-47s are the biggest, fastest, smartest and most effective water and retardant-dropping helitankers in the world. These helitankers can operate day or night and can fill their tanks with a retractable snorkel while hovering, allowing for a faster return to the fire line. "The QRF is the first in the world to conduct night 'hover-fill' operations," said Troy Whitman, an SCE fire manager. "In the past, aircraft would have to land for a ground refill because hover fills require someone to supervise from the air. Our S-76 intelligence aircraft has the capability to provide safe coordination at night."

Support and coordination do not end there. The goal is to be a self-contained operation with all resources at the ready. The ground support for the firefighting fleet can resemble that of a small airport.

If last year is any indicator, the QRF will be an indispensable tool for fire agencies during this year's peak fire season. The 2021 statistics were prolific:

- 1,836 drops on more than 50 separate fire incidents
- 2.6 million (equal to 4½ Olympic-sized pools), with 28% dropped at night
- 123,455 gallons of fire retardant, with 19% dropped at night

"The efficiency and speed of the fleet is impressive," said Whitman. "In the past, aircraft would fly to a fixed location miles away from the incident. They land, refill for five minutes and then go back to the incident. With the QRF and the army of mobile support, there is no extensive transit, and the hover fill can get done in about 90 seconds."

Fire season is year-round in Orange County, and the threat is particularly high for communities adjacent to wildland areas such as Lake Forest. STAY SAFE OC: TALK TO YOUR CHILDREN ABOUT ELECTRIC BICYCLE SAFETY

By having proactive conversations with your children, you can help keep them safe as they ride their bicycles in the community.


It is important for parents to make sure their children know the rules of the road and basic bike safety practices before allowing their children to ride. Make sure to have conversations often to reiterate the importance of bike safety. Here are some key messages your children should understand. Helmets are a must! No exceptions. Accidents happen, so let's make sure you're protected! All children under 18 are required by law to wear a helmet, but it is strongly recommended for everyone who rides a bicycle to always wear helmet. We encourage parents to always set a good example for their children and wear your helmet when you ride.

Make sure your helmet fits properly to ensure the highest level of protection:

- Your helmet should fit snugly and sit flat on top of your head
- Measure one or two finger-widths above your eyebrow to find the right helmet-placement spot
- When adjusting the side straps, make sure the straps form a "Y" and meet right below your ear
- The chin strap should fit snugly with room for no more than one finger under the strap

Cover basic traffic laws - Bicyclists have the same rights and responsibilities on the road as motorists, so it is important for your children to understand basic traffic laws. Talk to them about:

- Always riding with the flow of traffic
- Coming to a complete stop at all stop signs and traffic signals
- Making eye contact with drivers before entering any intersection
- Learning hand signals and using them appropriately



- Check their bicycle and ensure it is in good working condition: check the tires, chain, and brakes
- Never ride more than one person to a bicycle
- Avoid wearing headphones while riding
- Always ride defensively never assume others see you



IRRIGATION, POLLUTION & POWER SHUT OFFS

About 50 percent of residential water use is for landscape irrigation. An unhealthy irrigation system can waste your money, our water resources and contribute, to pollution. Paying a little attention to your irrigation system to eliminate irrigation runoff fights pollution, conserves our limited water resources, and saves money!

Irrigation controllers depend on a constant supply of power to maintain their programming, and most have a backup battery in the case of a power outage — that is, if the battery is still holding a charge. When the backup power supply is lost, your controller could reset to its factory settings, causing excessive irrigation and runoff. This type of runoff is prohibited because it can mobilize pollutants such as sediment, bacteria, and nutrients. These pollutants can be transported, untreated, to our creeks, lakes, and the ocean.

In addition, power outages have become more common in response to the ongoing drought and the increased risk of fire. Southern California Edison issues Public Safety Power Shutoffs to reduce the threat of fire. This safety measure can have an unfortunate by-product... resetting your irrigation controller and causing runoff pollution!

How can you prevent this type of water waste and pollution?

- Routinely replace back-up batteries to ensure they are holding a charge (consider doing this at the same time as your smoke detectors).
- After a PSPS, look at your irrigation controller and confirm that your programming did not reset to factory settings during the power shutoff.
- Consider the season. Irrigation programming should be changed periodically based on weather conditions and your plant's needs (they need more water in the summer than they do in the winter).

APPLICATIONS NOW AVAILABLE FOR NEIGHBORHOOD PRIDE PAINT PROGRAM

The City has established its Neighborhood Pride Paint Program to maintain and improve the character, aesthetic quality and property values within the community. The Lake Forest Community Development Block Grant funds the program, providing the opportunity for qualified homeowners to have the exterior of their home painted at no cost to the homeowner.

Eligibility: Properties must be owner-occupied; the home or mobile home must be in need of painting as determined by the City; owners may not have assets in excess of \$120,000, excluding the value of the home; the existing exterior paint must be lead-free; and homeowners must not exceed income limits listed below, as determined by household size defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the previous 2 years.

Income Limit by Household Size

- 1-Person household \$ 75,900
- 2-Person household \$ 86,750
- 3-Person household \$ 97.600
- 4-Person household \$108,400
- 5-Person household \$117,100
- 6-Person Household \$125.750

Due to funding constraints, the number of owner-occupied homes or mobile homes selected to participate is limited and will be based on randomized selection.

Lake Forest is home to a 'Safe Exchange Zone' at the Orange County Sheriff's Department Saddleback Substation, 20202 Windrow Dr., near the Lake Forest Sports Park. The area, marked off with green and white stripes, has 24-hour video surveillance and is intended to be a safe space for child custody exchanges, property exchanges after online purchases, and similar transactions.

EXPAND THE FOREST

Since Lake Forest incorporated in December 1991, the City Council has supported Expand the Forest, a landscape improvement program that encourages citizen participation in tree planting and provides an opportunity for urban forest enhancement while minimizing the financial responsibility of the City.

An Expand the Forest memorial tree is \$90. The application includes a selected tree palette of approved trees and available parks. Citizen sponsors receive a formal Certificate of Dedication signed by the City Council.





Are you 60 years or older? A resident of Lake Forest and do not drive or do not own a vehicle? We have transportation for you with CA Yellow Cab! There are three options:

- \$2.00 One Way (\$4.00 Round Trip) Within Lake Forest city limits to non-emergency medical appointments, socializing, movies, etc.
- \$5.00 One Way (\$10.00 Round Trip) To and from non-emergency medical appointments to Saddleback Memorial Hospital, Mission Hospital, South County Orthopedic Specialist, Kaiser Hospital (Irvine), and Hoag Hospital (Irvine).
- \$10.00 Lost Card Fee A \$10 fee will be charged to any taxi participant who has lost their card and requires a replacement card.

For new program users to take advantage of the Senior Taxi Cab program:


- You must have a current DMV Identification Card verifying that you're a Lake Forest resident to take part in this program.
